Objective

To establish and document a process for the identification of community values, and to ensure that these traditional, non-economic values are incorporated into the sustainable development and integrated resource management planning process.

Description

Historical, cultural, spiritual and recreational values, collectively referred to as intrinsic values are often “understood” to exist within a community, but without actually acknowledging and documenting them, they tend to be overlooked in land use and resource development plans. By compiling and verifying intrinsic values within communities, they can be considered when planning for sustainable development and resource management. The objective of this project was accomplished through a pilot community project, and the development of a workbook, to provide communities with guidelines for developing a community values mapping process and effective public involvement in resource management and sustainable development planning.
